## **WSYA Winners 2009:**

### **Young People act on United Nations Millennium Goals using Internet Contents**

**Salzburg/New York, April 27, 2009** – From online music and TV communities to interactive gaming platforms to e-learning applications and HIV/AIDS resources, the World Summit Youth Award (WSYA) presents young people who use Internet and Mobiles to get Action on United Nations Millennium Development goals.

The Winners were selected from over 600 applicants hailing from 100+ countries, in five WSYA categories: **Fight Poverty, Hunger and Disease ! Education for all ! Power 2 Women ! Create Your Culture ! Go Green !**

“While many leaders of the world fight the banking and economic crisis, young people fight the everyday crises in their communities and show that the Millennium Development Goals must be acted on concretely” says Peter A. Bruck, the Chairman of the World Summit Award. “The winning projects show how the world can be made a better place when the MDGs do not remain just government or a distant UN agenda” Bruck adds.

The WSYA winners will take centre stage in Monterrey, Mexico during the United Nations Global Forum on ICT and Development and WSA Winners Celebrations in June 10-13, 2009. They will showcase their projects to government and business leaders, representatives of civil society and the international community.

Organized within the framework of the UN World Summit on the Information Society, the Youth Award is organised by the World Summit Award (WSA) Network for the second time after 2005 in partnership with the Cyber Peace Initiative (CPI), Egypt. It is held under the patronage of H.E. Suzanne Mubarak, Founder & President of the Suzanne Mubarak Women’s International Peace Movement; Commissioner Ferrero-Waldner, Member of the European Commission responsible for External Relations and European Neighbourhood; and Mag. Gabi Burgstaller, Provincial Governor of Salzburg, Austria. Sponsors of WSYA include CPI, Egypt; Indigo Brainmedia, Mexico; and the Internet Society (ISOC).

WSYA is both, a showcase to the world for young designers, technologists and e-Content creators as well as a contribution on a global scale to addressing poverty, protecting the environment, sharing knowledge and empowering young people.

The over 600 projects were evaluated in a three-round judging process by an international jury of 20 experts in the fields of youth engagement, new media and social entrepreneurship.

The WSYA selects and promotes best practice in e-Content and technological creativity, demonstrates young people's potential to create outstanding digital contents and serves as a platform for people from all UN member states to work together in the efforts to reduce poverty and hunger, and to tackle ill-health, gender inequality, lack of education, lack of access to clean water and environmental degradation.

The WSYA will be organised 2008 to 2009 as a follow up activity of the World Summit on Information Society and its action plan towards the year 2015. The Youth Award is organised by the World Summit Award Network for the second time after 2005. The 2008/09 contest is organised in partnership with the Cyber Peace Initiative (CPI) launched by the Suzanne Mubarak Women's International Peace Movement in 2007.
